Seasons at Amanoi

Situated in south-central Vietnam – within Nui Chua National Park's Unesco-listed Biosphere Reserve – Amanoi boasts a distinct microclimate, characterised by minimal rainfall and more than 250 sunny days a year, opening up the possibility for year-round travel. From March to October, Amanoi experiences dry, hot weather, and even from June to September – when cities like Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City face rain – Amanoi consistently enjoys dry weather.

These favourable conditions invite guests to celebrate a full 12-month calendar of events at Amanoi. From major international holidays to traditional local festivals, every season presents a fresh opportunity to experience the wonders of coastal Vietnam.





January

January marks the dawn of a new year, a time when resolutions are made and hopes are high. It's a month steeped in possibility, where people around the world embark on journeys both physical and spiritual to set the tone for the months ahead. As part of Amanoi's curated festive programme, guests are invited to join a local Cham blessing on New Year's Day to usher in good fortune and wellbeing for the coming year.


With temperatures ranging from a comfortable 22 to 29°C, the pleasant January climate – known as one of the mildest in Vinh Hy – serves as a natural invitation to embrace the new year with energy and enthusiasm.

For those seeking a more active annual start, a trek to Goga Peak is known for its breathtaking views at sunrise, while the 20km Nui Chua-King Mountain trek reveals sweeping views of the lush vegetation-dotted landscape.

February


February in Vietnam brings the vibrant celebration of Tet, also known as Lunar New Year – a time when families come together to usher in the forthcoming months. As each auspicious year unfolds, Amanoi is always delighted to offer a curated programme of events to immerse guests in the richness of Vietnamese tradition. Join in calligraphy sessions, pagodas visits timed to take in local ceremonies, Tet 'chung' cake workshops and mesmerising performances.

Valentine's Day also offers couples the chance to enjoy secluded moments with private treatments in Aman's Wellness Pool Villas – each with its own 15-metre pool, steam room, cold plunge pool and Jacuzzi – or a romantic dinner by the lotus-covered lake.

March

In March, the region is garlanded by elegant neem flowers, coinciding with International Women's Day. As these exquisite blooms unfurl, they blanket the national park in a delicate shade of white, creating a contrast to the greenery.

As sun-drenched days usher in a period of warmth, fishermen set sail into the crystalline waters, commencing the season for prized mackerel and anchovy. A stroll through Vinh Hy fishing village offers a perfect start to the day, followed by breakfast in a local's home, savouring authentic flavours while forging connections with the community.

March also brings forth the spectacle of rice paddy fields, ripe and ready for harvest, painting the countryside in hues of amber and gold. Guests are invited to join a scenic tour to Ba Tang waterfall, which passes by the quaint Da Hang village, showcasing the surrounding fields.

April



As evening descends, indulge in authentic Vietnamese hospitality at Ong Nam's house in the village – owned by an elderly couple and their family, who've been fishermen for generations. Here, amid the convivial atmosphere, feast on a Vietnamese family-style meal, rich in home-cooked dishes and cultural heritage.

May


In May, the region basks in sunshine, painting the landscape gold and infusing the air with warmth. As mango trees unfold, orchards burst with vibrant greens and golden fruits, tranquil lakes become havens for little egrets and the hum of cicadas fills the air

It's the perfect time to embark on the Wild Cat trek, tracing the wild civet through Amanoi's surrounding wilderness and forest. For those seeking a more intimate experience, embark on a serene boat ride to Vinh Hy Bay, before journeying to Amanoi's cliffside Twilight Cliff Lounge for an unparalleled vantage point of the mountain ranges of Nui Chua National Park at sunset, reserved for just four people with Champagne and tapas served.

June

In June, Vinh Hy is adorned with the queen crape myrtle, vibrant blooms which paint the area in shades of magenta, as the azure waters of Amanoi's private beach beckon. Amid this vibrant tapestry, you can also spot flocks of squirrels frolicking in the grounds and colourful lizards hiding in the foliage.

This is the perfect time to enjoy every aspect of the beach, where a plethora of water sports awaits, including paddleboarding, kayaking and snorkelling. Another way to savour the seaside serenity is a beach lunch picnic, spotting corals amid the shallows as you dine al fresco on the sand in an experience that kids will love.

July


In July, the peak turtle-nesting season arrives in the tranquil surroundings of Rock Park. Here amid rugged landscapes, Bai Thit is a revered site where generations of endangered green turtles return to lay their eggs each year – representing the only mainland spot in Vietnam where turtles still come to nest.

July is also the season to seek out blue and pilot whales along Vinh Hy Bay, as warm summer waters attract these magnificent marine giants, making it a prime time for whale watching.

August

Amanoi's surrounding Ninh Thuan province sits within the driest area of Vietnam, with its own semi-arid climate, reminiscent of desert regions. Against this backdrop, a striking phenomenon occurs: the blooming of cactus flowers. Amid the rugged terrain, these hardy succulents burst into vibrant displays of pink, red and orange, making it an ideal time to join a painting class to capture the beauty of nature.

The region also reaches the peak season of its grape harvest. Despite being an international secret of sorts, Ninh Thuan is famed throughout Vietnam for its succulent grapes and this month sees the landscape adorned with bountiful vineyards.

An ideal activity during this time is to embark on a cycling tour around Thai An village, where the grape fields flourish. Aided by gentle breeze, guests can pedal along scenic pathways that wind through lush vineyards, each row bursting with clusters ripe for the picking.

September


In September, the locals celebrate the vibrant Mid-Autumn Festival, a cherished tradition that marks the arrival of the most beautiful full moon of the year. For children, the Mid-Autumn Festival is a day of pure joy and excitement. The streets of Vinh Hy come alive with the colourful spectacle of lion dances, where performers don costumes and parade through the town, accompanied by the rhythmic beat of drums and cymbals. Amid the festivities, children eagerly anticipate the highlight of the celebration: delicious mooncakes. These sweet treats (filled with rich lotus-seed or sweet-bean paste) are lovingly crafted and shared among family and friends.

September also marks a great time for guests to take a moment to marvel at the night sky during an evening of stargazing or come together for a magical evening of private outdoor cinema, where the glow of the full moon adds to the cinematic experience.

October


In October, Ninh Thuan comes alive with the vibrant celebrations of the Cham New Year, known as the Kate Festival. This auspicious occasion, which falls on the seventh month of the Cham calendar, is a time of joy, renewal and cultural reverence for the Cham community, filled with colour and pageantry, elaborate processions, spirited dances and intricate rituals. Dressed in vibrant traditional attire, participants parade through the streets, carrying ornately decorated palanquins and offerings to be presented at the temples.

During this time, join a tour exploring the rich cultural heritage of the Cham people by visiting the revered Cham temple named after King Po Klong Garai in Phan Rang, marvelling at the intricate carvings and ornate details that adorn the temple walls, while gaining insight into the spiritual beliefs and cultural practices of the Cham people. Amanoi also offers the opportunity to join a Cham pottery class, led by a local master.




November
