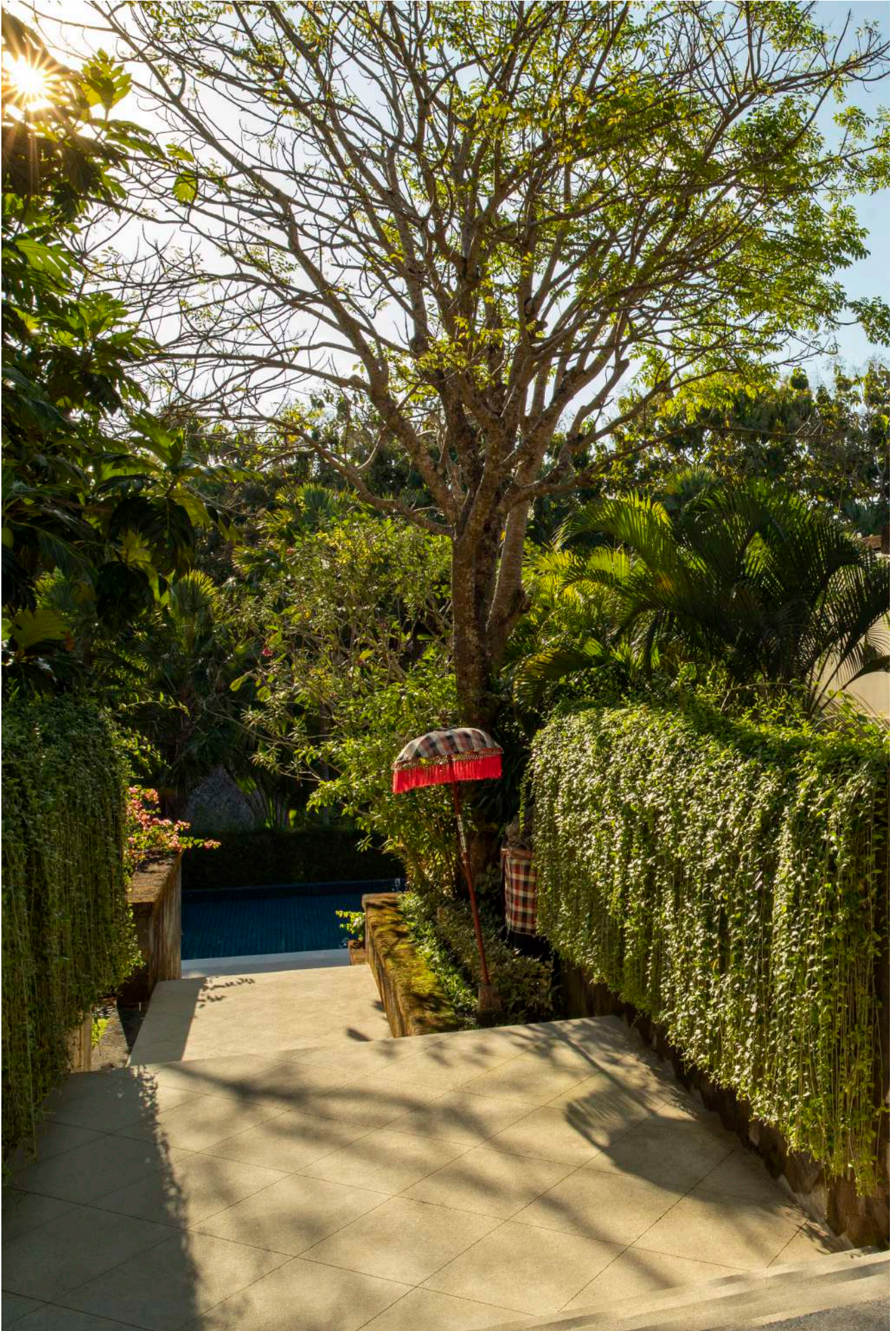

'The Island of the Gods', 'The Morning of the World', 'The Last Paradise' and 'The Land of Magic', Bali is known by many complimentary names and for good reason. Aman Villas offers a range of bespoke experiences revealing Bali's rich spiritual and cultural heritage.

Pura Geger Private Blessing

Pura Geger is a sacred temple serving local families that is rarely open to tourists. As part of our Aman Villas family, you and yours can enjoy exclusive access to the temple for a private blessing – a moving and deeply meaningful experience offering insight into the all-encompassing spirituality of the Balinese.

Performed by a local Hindu priest, the Hindu prayers that form the blessing ask for hope, physical strength and determination, ensuring the blessed can face all life's challenges with happiness and fortitude. After being blessed with tirta (holy water) and bija (consecrated rice), a yarn bracelet will be tied around your wrist, to be worn as long as you desire.

You may choose to visit the temple in our vintage VW convertible for a truly unique experience.

Aksara Bali

The Balinese script, known as Aksara Bali, is an abugida – a type of writing system whose basic characters denote consonants followed by a particular vowel, with diacritics denoting other vowels. It is used for writing the Balinese language and the liturgical language of Sanskrit. Considered the most elaborate and ornate amongst the Brahmic scripts of Southeast Asia, it plays an important role in many of the island's traditional ceremonies, appearing in religious texts on lontar or palm-leaf manuscripts.

Our younger guests can join the Balinese students from Basa Bali as they learn to write this script, helping to preserve this special part of Bali's unique heritage.

Sacred Temple Tour

To experience the true essence of Bali, we have curated a fascinating tour of three temples tracing the steps of Dang Hyang Nirartha, a Javanese high priest who came to the island in 1537 in search of a sacred site where he could achieve enlightenment.

Since his time, religious devotion is still as much a part of daily life in Bali as eating, sleeping and breathing. Delicate floral offerings are placed each morning at dainty spirit houses, regular festivals and processions fill the streets with colour and beautiful Balinese Hindu temples known as pura dot the island. The three you will visit on this personalised tour include Pura Geger, Pura Gunung Payung and Bali's most famous temple, Pura Luhur Uluwatu, all within a one-hour drive of Aman Villas. Each temple has its own unique history and legends, as well as photogenic Candi Bentar gateways, holy caves and breathtaking views from lofty terraces.

Balinese Cooking Class

Learn the secrets of Indonesian cuisine in this hands-on cooking class with our talented Balinese sous chef. Recipes have been passed down through the generations and remain uncorrupted by modern additives, ensuring a freshness of flavour unique to this historic region.

You will be guided step-by-step in the preparation of a multi-course Indonesian meal. Once your meal is complete, savour the fruits of your labour beside the Villa pool or in your own private dining bale.



Culinary Indulgences

The finest cuisine is transportive and revelatory, taking you on a sensory journey that reveals the secrets of a destination and its culinary legacy without requiring a single step.

At Aman Villas at Nusa Dua, every mouthful – both Indonesian and international – is curated to your requirements by your private chef and served wherever you choose by two personal Butlers.

Fresh seafood from the surrounding waters features in the daily specials, and the fertile farms and terraced gardens of the island grow much of the produce used in the kitchen. Dining spots include the dining area in each Villa's main pavilion, pool terraces, garden-ensconced dining bales and of course, the privacy of your own room. Private breakfasts and special dinners can be enjoyed at the Beach Terrace.

With market ingredients and fresh seafood sourced daily, every meal – whether a beach BBQ, a candlelit dinner in the garden, or a cooking class culminating in a traditional Balinese feast – adds further layers of flavour and colour to your experience of this special place.

Megibung Feast

Indulge in the Megibung Feast, with a menu inspired by the late King of Karangasem - I Gusti Agung Ketut Karangasem - in 1692. Megibung means 'to share from one platter' and this type of dining is commonly used for festive and ceremonial occasions.

Our Megibung starts with a Balinese soup, followed by a platter of Balinese dishes that surround a nasi tumpeng, which is a cone of rice representing Mt. Agung, where the Hindu mother temple of Besakih is located. The Balinese dishes include a two-hour slow-roasted Balinese chicken in palm bark, local fish wrapped and cooked in banana leaf, tuna, fish satay and authentic Balinese salads celebrating the quality and abundance of fresh ingredients that the island provides. The Megibung Feast is followed by a selection of local Balinese sweets.

Poolside Barbecue Dinner

Dine by the candlelight beside your Villa's pool, with a multi-course menu specially curated by your private Chef. A tailor-made menu and live cooking showcase the fresh and locally sourced ingredients of this dining experience, prepared to your liking and cooked over a traditional coconut husk barbecue. The warm candlelit setting creates an ideal atmosphere to celebrate a birthday or special occasion.

Movie Night

Available on request, transform the outdoor area of your Villa into a private cinema surrounding the pool and spend a memorable evening seated under the stars with an exclusive Villa Movie Night. A projector screen, the projector, a sound speaker and Chromecast will be set up. Spa and Wellness

Massage

Drawing on traditional Balinese therapies, we incorporate several different massage techniques that focus on easing tension and stimulating circulation. Deep thumb pressure, known locally as 'urut', is combined with acupressure and palm pressure methods to activate and soothe the body from head to toe.

Private Yoga

Book a private session with our Balinese yoga teacher, who teaches all levels of Hatha Yoga, or with our local community yoga teacher, a specialist in Ashtanga Yoga. Both are very knowledgeable about the Balinese Hindu religion should you have any questions.

Spiritual Healing Session with Pak Bagjo Indrijanto

Bagjo Indrijanto's deep understanding of Javanese spirituality and culture started when he was 8 years old, learning directly from his family. Through years of spiritual experiences and practices, Bagjo has developed his own holistic approach which includes Spiritual Reading and healing through divine energy and meditation (Tapa Brata or Mengening in Javanese) to help reach the state of calmness (Lerem) and inner peace for a clear understanding of life.



Arts, Crafts, Galleries and Museums

Many of our guests are patrons of the arts, avid collectors or artists themselves. With the insider access Aman Villas can provide on this art-rich island, they may well have found their Nirvana.

Painting

Spend a few hours or even a full day with the local artist I Made Somadita in the comfort of your villa, exploring your creativity while learning to paint using traditional Balinese art techniques. This almost meditative experience is deeply relaxing and is accompanied by homemade light bites and refreshments.

Textile Drapery

Learn more about Bali's cultural heritage from the perspective of fashion with a demonstration on how to wear traditional woven textiles without any tailoring. The session will conclude with a photo shoot.

Silk Painting

Silk painting is a centuries-old technique that has been passed down and perfected throughout many generations of Balinese artists. Create your own silk painting during a one-on-one workshop with a renowned silk painter from Ubud.

Pasifika Art Museum, Nusa Dua

Each of the 11 rooms is dedicated to a specific region or group of artists, taking you on a visual journey through Indonesia, Indochina, Polynesia, Melanesia and China.

Garuda Wisnu Kenca Cultural Park

Garuda Wisnu Kencana (GWK) is a cultural park and iconic landmark that features a towering statue of the Hindu god Vishnu riding the mythical bird Garuda. The centrepiece of GWK is the Garuda Wisnu statue, which stands at an impressive height of 121 meters (397 feet), making it the tallest statue in Indonesia and one of the tallest in the world. The statue depicts the god Vishnu, known as the preserver and protector in Hindu mythology, riding on the back of Garuda, the national emblem of Indonesia. The statue is a remarkable display of artistry and craftsmanship, representing the rich cultural and spiritual heritage of Bali.

Beyond Aman Villas at Nusa Dua

A myriad of opportunities allows guests to explore the regency beyond the resort, from cycle rides over Nusa Dua's rolling hills to exploring the rocky cliffs of Uluwatu. We recommend doing outdoor activities in the morning, as the afternoons can get very warm.

Adventures

Cycling

There is no better way to explore than on two wheels, as you can cover a significant amount of ground while remaining open to the sights and sounds of the landscapes around you. Cycle down to the Beach Terrace from your Villa and discover its long boardwalk that makes for pleasant cycling (and walks) accompanied by soothing seascapes. Or let your butler arrange a cycle tour of the peninsula. We offer fully suspended mountain bikes and guided or self-guided routes to suit all levels of fitness.

Running and Jogging

Nusa Dua is located in the thriving tourist area on Bali's southeast coast. It is renowned for its beautiful beaches, luxurious hotels, and well-maintained jogging paths. The area is renowned for its safety and cleanliness, as the jogging routes are carefully developed and maintained to provide a comfortable environment in which runners can enjoy themselves. Moreover, the pleasant weather adds to jogging's enjoyment and comfort. The jogging track from Sawangan to BTDC (Bali Tourism Development Corporation) offers access to the beach and enhances the sports experience for runners who enjoy the view of the sea.

Helicopter Tours

Bali Circle Air Tour

Nusa Dua – Kintamani – Ubud – Tanah Lot

Enjoy an exhilarating 60-minute helicopter ride with spectacular views of Bali's most iconic sights. After ascending, head north towards Kintamani, passing the classic Sanur Beach area, and enjoy a superb view of Lake Batur and the summit of Mount Batur. Continue towards Ubud, passing Tampak Siring, taking in breathtaking panoramas of the sculptured rice terraces known as 'terasering' and the lush river valleys. The ride continues towards Tanah Lot to observe the legendary sea temple from the air. End by flying over the Seminyak and Kuta coastline before returning to Nusa Dua.

Nusa Islands Sky Tour

Nusa Penida – Nusa Lembongan – Nusa Ceningan

Take to the sky for the most incredible views of the nearby Nusa Islands. Your tour will include Nusa Penida and the iconic cliffs that form the shape of a T-Rex lapped by turquoise seas at Kelingking Beach. Fly home via the white sandy beaches of Nusa Lembongan that overlook the yellow bridge of Nusa Ceningan.

Tailormade Tours

Seeing Bali from the air is an unforgettable experience and our team is always available to help you create exclusive, personally tailored travel itineraries by helicopter (or any other form of transport). Helicopter tours are subject to weather conditions and usually take place from 12 noon onwards.



Private Boat Trips

Snorkelling

The Snorkelling trip tour to Nusa Penida, in cooperation with East Bali Surf and Sail, invite you to explore Nusa Penida, an island southeast of Bali, famed for its raw natural beauty, picturesque landscapes, rugged coastlines, and crystal-clear waters with vibrant marine life.

Among the favourite spots at Nusa Penida is Manta Bay, known for its majestic manta rays. Crystal Bay allows excellent visibility of marine life and coral formations, immersing snorkelers in a stunning underwater world. Gamer Bay, a hidden gem, offers a tranquil snorkelling experience away from crowds, with calm waters perfect for discovering diverse marine species and coral gardens. Lastly, Toya Pakeh is renowned for diverse marine life and vibrant coral reefs, presenting an opportunity to encounter various fish species, including tropical fish and larger pelagic fish, in their natural habitat.

The snorkelling trip will be held on a private speed boat which can accommodate up to 6 guests. The total duration is 6 hours, allowing ample time to fully enjoy each spot.

Fishing

Take a thrilling 6-hour fishing trip to Sanur Beach, with East Bali Surf and Sail. On a private speed boat with up to six guests, you can enjoy both the low fishing and exciting Trolling. You will find the serenity of Sanur Beach, its sand expanse and sunrise views that offer a refuge for beach lovers.

For all anglers at this level, the trips offer catches linked to reef fish such as snappers, Groupers and Triggerfish. Try fishing for swift species such as tuna, mahimahi, wahoo or billfish to see how exciting this can be. There are many fish species at Sanur Beach, including snappers, groupers, barracuda and a whole lot more. The availability of fish varies according to the seasons, regulations and locations.

Hobie Cat Sailing

In cooperation with East Bali Surf and Sail, book a scenic one-hour cruise of the greater Sanur beach area on one of our Hobie Cat 16s. The thrill of rushing across the sea with our experienced Balinese captains will be a highlight of your trip. Maximum 2 adults and two small children per trip. We also offer the option of self-skippering to accomplished guest sailors.



Golf

The golf courses in Bali are as diverse as the island itself and all are within relatively easy reach of Aman Villas.

Bali National Golf Club

After a superb re-design by Nelson & Haworth golf course architects, the stunning Bali National Golf Club is located directly adjacent to Aman Villas. This championship course offers a truly unique golfing experience, which is both challenging and enjoyable to players of all levels.

The par 72 tournament-standard golf course measures 7,166 yards from the back tees and starts on the outward nine playing up through verdant green, rolling hills and tropical fauna. The fourth hole, a deceptive uphill 158-yard par-3, ends on the green with rewarding views of Bali's holy mountain, Gunung Agung. Hole 8, a par 4, requires an accurate tee shot through a wooded ravine. Water features heavily on the way to the 9th green with a babbling brook running the length of the fairway and a picturesque lake to the right of the green, home to a wonderful variety of birds. The inward nine plays on level land through coconut trees and a series of man-made lakes. Hole 17, a signature hole, is Bali's answer to the famous TPCC Sawgrass #17, in Florida.

New Kuta Golf

On the southwestern rim of the Bukit Peninsula, perched above a limestone cliff overlooking Dreamland and Balangan beaches, this scenic 18-hole course is located 30 minutes drive from Aman Villas.

New Kuta Golf is a championship standard course and the first links-style layout in Indonesia. It will challenge both the low handicapper and reward the novice. With five sets of tees, there is enough variety to ensure a satisfying experience for all skill levels.

Bukit Pandawa Golf and Country Club

Bukit Pandawa Golf and Country Club is the first golf course of its kind in Bali, if not in all of Southeast Asia, with 18 championship-calibre par-3 holes. While the par-54 layout is a time-saver, with a typical round lasting just 120 minutes, it is not short on its challenges.

Set across a limestone cliff top as it meanders through dramatic rock outcroppings and terraced rice paddy fields, the course in itself is an artistic statement, with the spectacular white sandy beach and the Indian Ocean as its backdrop.

The recommended time to visit the beach is in the morning to seep in the warm light of the sunrise. Light snacks can be ordered in advance to accompany your time there.

Surfing

Aman Villas is delighted to introduce surfing experiences for our guests, in association with East Bali Surf & Sail (EBSS).

This truly authentic and uniquely Balinese experience is for all levels of surfers, from beginners to advanced, with accomplished Balinese surf guides from East Bali Surf & Sail accompanying you on your surfing adventure.

Sanur Surf Breaks

For beginners, the Sanur Reef headquarters of the East Bali Surf & Sail is the ideal spot to learn from scratch or sharpen your skills if you are a little rusty.

For the intermediate and more advanced surfers, the surf guides, who are pioneers of the East Bali breaks, will tailor-make an unforgettable experience and take you to the most hidden and uncrowded surf breaks in East Bali.

Hyatt Reef

A few kilometres south of Sanur Reef is the Hyatt Reef, the home base of EBSS. Here, we take beginners out on the boat to the baby reef and get them standing on their boards generally in knee- to waist-high white water.

For the intermediate to advanced surfers, we go across the reef to where the bigger waves are suitable for fit intermediate and advanced surfers only.

Booties are optional.

Sanur Baby

300 metres north of the Bali Beach Hotel, in front of Matahari Terbit Beach, is a gentle beach break we call 'Sanur Baby,' which is suitable for beginners.

Booties are optional.

Sanur Reef

This famous right-hander is one of the best waves in Bali when it breaks overhead. Recommended for intermediate and advanced surfers only, as it breaks over sharp coral.

Used by locals, this is a territorial break, and you are required to be accompanied by our local guides to have a memorable session.

Booties are optional.



South Bali Surf Breaks

Bingin

Bingin's hollow, fast barrel is addictive for experienced surfers who know how to handle it. However, expect competition from every visitor and local for all the barrels they can score for the day. You should also watch out for the 'stop-sign,' the raised coral that has prematurely ended many a great surfing vacation for visiting surfers.

Take Bingin for what it is, a short left-hand wave that can cost you if you try to get more out of it than you deserve!

Uluwatu

Uluwatu has been attracting surfers since the seventies. Uluwatu's five breaks offer surfers consistent swells with multiple chances to show off their skills. Not surprisingly, the place has grown quite crowded over the years.

Uluwatu provides the most exhilarating challenge during monsoon season when the biggest swells hit the island. The temptation of taking on those 15-foot waves should be tempered by knowledge of the dangerous conditions – don't leave shore without a big board and a sturdy leash.

Nusa Dua

Newbies be warned: Nusa Dua's shallow, sharp reef bottom and powerful, huge right-hand waves should be left to the experts. Nusa Dua is always ready with a wave on hand, including some of the biggest in town – at about 15 feet on a good day.

Nusa Dua is Bali's best rainy season surfing destination, peaking between October and April, with good access throughout the year.

Padang-Padang

The 'Bali Pipeline's' surprising ferocity keeps professional surfers on their toes with huge swells and gigantic barrels that are about as fun to watch as they are to surf.

The downside: a wipeout here is more painful than most, as the sharp reef bottom and powerful swells create board-breaking, flesh-shredding situations that no one should attempt at low tide. Avoid if you're a beginner, take precautions if you're an expert.

Balangan

Balangan at high tide is great for beginners, who can easily ride this reef break's long left-hand waves. On really good days, the big waves provide an irresistible challenge for expert surfers.

The vibe at Balangan is friendly and low-key, with less competition due to the smaller crowds compared to Kuta and Uluwatu.



Children and Family

Aman Villas at Nusa Dua is ideal for families, with activities to suit all ages. Most include references to Balinese culture and craftsmanship, adding an immersive educational aspect.

Swimming with a Pro

Whether your kids are still learning to swim or would like to improve their strokes while having a lot of fun, we can arrange professional swimming instructors to teach and entertain your kids in your villa's swimming pool. Your little ones will have the time of their lives while you can relax and enjoy some adult downtime.

Making Balinese Offerings

Aman Villas staff will demonstrate how to make a simple Balinese floral offering, known as 'canang sari', from local flowers and young coconut leaves. These beautiful, fragrant offerings are used by Hindus during their daily prayers in their homes or temples.

Kids Painting Class

An excellent activity for fostering creative expression, this painting class will include step-by-step instructions to ensure younger participants create something they are truly proud of. As well as sketching techniques, our instructor will share tips on colouring using acrylic paints. Options are also provided to either paint on canvas or a tote bag.

Cooking Class

Private Balinese Dance Class

Fun for the whole family, this class can be tailored to suit children, adults or a combination of both. A professional dance teacher from our neighbourhood will gently guide participants to learn the swaying movements of Balinese dance, as well as the basic sitting and standing positions known as 'Agem', eye and head movements and fan techniques.

Private Traditional Music Class

Learn to play two traditional instruments in this Private Traditional Music Class, the Rindik or Angklung with a professional music teacher from our neighbourhood who will gently guide the learning.

Rindik is a traditional Balinese musical instrument similar to the xylophone made from selected pieces of bamboo which are deliberately prepared for Rindik making materials. These bamboo pieces are then arranged at a certain distance and then beaten with a hammer to produce sound and tone.

While Angklung is a musical instrument made of a varying number of bamboo tubes attached to a bamboo frame. The tubes are carved to have a resonant pitch when struck and are tuned to octaves, similar to Western handbells. These two traditional bamboo instrument used in Balinese music and produces captivating harmonies when played together in an ensemble.
