Serenity in Central Java's cultural heartland. Perfectly placed for exploring the region's historic and natural attractions, or for simply relaxing in blissful surroundings.

Framed by emerald-green rice plains and the peaks of the Menoreh Hills in rural Central Java, Amanjiwo lies within view of the mystical stupas of Borobudur, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The Buddhist monument directly informs the design of Amanjiwo, a temple-like hideaway with a towering domed roof, colonnades, and walls built of local blush-beige paras stone.

### Locations

The fifth-largest island of the Indonesian archipelago and the most populous which is filled with an abundance of history of various cultures, Java lies between Sumatra and Bali, with the Java Sea to the north, and the Indian Ocean to the south. The lush landscape surrounding Amanjiwo is volcanic and ruggedly beautiful, and the area, scattered with temples and ruins is considered Indonesia's cultural heartland.

### Ancient Temples

In Java, great palaces and religious monuments from Hindu, Buddhist, and Islamic faiths were built. Legend has it that 2,000 temples once graced the plains of the Kedu Valley and its surrounding region. From Borobudur and Gedong Songo to Prambanan and the Dieng Plateau, many of Asia's most ancient and significant religious monuments and temples are located on the plains and volcanic slopes of Central Java, easily accessible from Amanjiwo.

### Yogyakarta

Once the capital of Indonesia, Yogyakarta is an epicentre of Javanese culture and traditional arts. Less than an hour's drive from Amanjiwo, the city offers full immersion into the Indonesia heritage, with its palace, royal gardens, museums, and contemporary galleries. By night, Yogyakarta (or Jogja as it is fondly known) comes alive, dazzling with its vibrant street fair on the main thoroughfare of Jalan Malioboro.

### Ruwatan

A guided ruwatan, a purification ritual, is available at the Progo River area for guests to complete the tranquil self-healing retreat at Amanjiwo. Guided by Joko Triagung, a renowned healer-shaman in Yogyakarta Province and is also a master of Kebatinan (inner-directed, mystical spirituality) with a focus on Tenaga Dalam, which literally means inner power, prana, and chi.

Amanjiwo, in its role showcasing Central Java's heritage, is delighted to introduce Patrick Vanhoebrouck, our Resident Anthropologist who has an incurable passion for Java.
